



COVID Strikes Again: January & February Meetings ~ CANCELED

TIMELY INFO: OMICRON VARIANT PRIMER

If you haven't yet been hit with the Omicron variant, know that it doesn't look much at all like the COVID we've come to recognize... and it spreads faster than any previous version of the virus. It's estimated to make up more than 95 percent of COVID infection in the U.S. right now, and it's perhaps so fast-spreading because it is so different, especially in people who've been vaccinated. The five most common symptoms —plus one—with Omicron are:

Runny Nose ~ the most reported symptoms are those of the common cold or flu

Headache ~ more likely to be frontal, felt in the forehead, not the back of the head

Fatigue ~ extreme tiredness, all-encompassing exhaustion, for one or two days

Sneezing ~ as it hits the upper respiratory system, it causes sniffles, congestion

Scratchy Throat ~ not a sore throat, and no noticeable fever

Night Sweats ~ repeated episodes of extreme drenching perspiration

Nasal congestion, dry cough, muscle pain or aches in the lower back are also regularly reported as early signs of the variant. Data is beginning to paint a clearer picture of how Omicron is different, including being more transmissible than Delta and evading the defenses provided by currently available vaccines. Symptoms are showing up within three days of exposure; current recommendations are to quarantine for five days, regardless of vaccination status., then continue to wear a mask and test before any 'indoor gatherings.'

WHAT'S BEEN GOING ON IN IKS IN RECENT MONTHS?

• **The IKS Board has been communicating** on-line for the most part, and finally voted to cancel meetings for January and February. The Covid numbers have been too high, and all agreed it was too risky to gather indoors right now. Also, with the new variant of Covid looking and acting more like the common cold, it's too easy for people to think they have "just a little cold" and sneak out when they're the most contagious.

• **Koi Auction:** Praying we'll be able to host an auction in 2022...of course, COVID-19 is still the determining factor. Looking at June.

• **Elections:** The board would like to know of any member with a desire to serve on the Board and in what capacity: there is always a possibility of a vacancy, and there are required term limitations.

We also need a new librarian, or someone to review the collection of books and videos we have available to determine what should be removed or retired.

• **Newsletter:** We are desperately in need of a new newsletter editor. Being sick this month has shown me, finally, that I cannot keep this up. And I don't want to.
