




Greetings,

Our March meeting was held at the home of club President Mac McClain and his family. The McClain pond is a 4000 gallon rubber liner pond containing 30 koi and one red neck slider turtle.

The weather was great, and proof of that was that 65 people that showed up for the meeting. This was one of the larger outings that we have had in recent times. We also had potentially three new families sign up as new members to our club. We had three guests including a friend of mine, Dorinda, who during our fish auction was able to purchase 6 large koi, and Armand who purchased one koi, at the fraction of the cost you would normally pay. (What a bargain!)

A big thanks to the Fales family for providing us with great prizes for our drawing. Like the auction, the drawing was a big hit, with members staying to the very end for the drawing.

During our April general meeting, at Francine Hoffman's home, we will be having our vote for the Koi person of the year and the Koi of the year. I would advise that you check with the person first, to make sure they want to be nominated.

Koi of the year selection will be done a little differently this year. In the past, the koi had to be placed in a blue tub and photographed to be entered in the contest. Because a lot of people are unable to catch their koi, to place them in a tub, this year we will allow you to submit photos of koi taken inside of you pond. One stipulation is that you can only have one koi in the photo. So get your cameras out, take photos of your best fish and bring them to the April meeting. The photo should be large enough for the people judging to be able to get a good look at your fish. Remember, you can't win if you don't enter.

The IKS scholarship committee is accepting applications for the annual \$500 scholarship from children of current members of the IKS. *The selection will be based on the following:*

- Must be attending college in the fall session of 2014, including college bound high school students
- Work or volunteer experience, related to the care or health of animals or fish
- Career goals, professional goals for the next five to ten years
- Community service, volunteer service to the community
- Academic performance, areas of study: GPA

- Academic transcripts (last school year or semester attended)

The first thing you experience as you drive up to Francine Hoffman's house is the abundance of color and plants and animal lover's signs. Her home interior has plenty of personal touches, but wait until you get to the back yard. If you notice the clock here says 1:30pm. That's your hint to get there early and enjoy her multiple garden spots. Upon entering her yard you'll notice the constant breeze and might hear the wind chime gently greeting you. It's a half acre and is the very private location she wanted. Francine is a pet person and loves her cats, Blackie and Sugar, and her dogs, Powwow and Jacques Pierre.



Like an Armstrong Nursery in your own back yard, it's a collection of beautiful mini-gardens, pockets of peace and tranquility. There are a couple of gazebos, multiple statues, mature trees that provide shady spots to sit and rest, walking paths, and bridges to cross. Her collection of plants, potted trees and other garden wonders and water features allow you to see her personality and what owning a home for a long time can accomplish. Names like *Mushroom Hill*, *Peacock Hill*, *Pomegranate Corner*, *Stone Creek* and *My Mountain Corner* showoff her imagination. Be sure to check out the patio area above the pond and her favorite spot, a seating area on a deck that was built under an older tree which is a natural shade umbrella.

For us koi hobbyists, Francine has 10 koi in her pond and who-knows-how-many goldfish, 30,40 or more? So many that she has another pond and waterfall just for them. The larger koi pond has an in-wall skimmer and a bottom drain. It's about 10 by 25 and holds about 4,000 gallons. Her filter is a Savio waterfall type. She designed her koi pond and her nephew Dave, an electrical engineer, built it for her. It was their first pond experience, and it looks great.

All through our discussion about her pond and koi, Powwow, her schnoodle (a Schnauzer and Poodle mix) kept himself in the middle of things, making sure we knew it was all about him and not the koi. Francine says you can't hurt his feelings by swooshing him away because he's just such a simple little guy who wants to be a part of everything.

Francine comes from a well-educated family and, after completing her basic education, she went on through college and became a second grade teacher. As a new teacher she got those students who had been held back, meaning there were more than just sweet little seven-year olds in her classes.

Some were even nine years old and getting taller and louder. She had her hands full as a brand new teacher, but she loved every one of her students and it showed through in their success (she did not say she had any 10 -them along). After doing this for 10 or 15 years, her principal asked her to teach kindergarten and she absolutely loved the little ones, fresh to the learning environment. If you meet or already know Francine and reflect back on your first days in school, you will say, "I wish I had her as my first teacher." Modestly, she gave all the credit to her parent volunteers in Lake Elsinore who contributed their time and support. She taught until she had to retire to win her personal battle with

cancer, which was in 2005.

Francine has written a book, a collection of short stories that feature three of the special friends she has had throughout her life. On the back wall of her house you'll see a painting dedicated to her 25-yearlong special friend, Lorraine, who she lost suddenly due to a brain aneurism. She also has a group of close friends who have been together since the 4th grade; they see each other regularly and share their longtime memories together.


A big supporter of our IKS, Francine told us how the club performed a **real** koi rescue by freeing one of her koi. It had become trapped in a tie wire she was using to hold water plants in place by the rocks so the koi could not take them and ravage them, as they like to do. She credits Tom Ross and Tom Wright with saving "Brownie" one of her favorite koi.



We are always assured an interesting time at the McClains', even if the least we do is explore the property. Did you meet the horses, hens and peacock? Did you hear the frogs in the little pond by the fence beyond the koi pond? Did you even see it?! Did you see the red and white vineyard—freshly planted *pinot grigio* grapevines for Jill and reds for Mac? Did you notice 50 new solar panels in the field (*summer shade for the horses, too*)? The switch hadn't been flipped yet; Edison has to figure out the paperwork!

expect a wonderful lunch at our meetings and interesting new people to get to know. This month was no exception! Besides a wonderful buffet (*must get Laura Nyirady's kale salad recipe!*), we had several new visitors: Armand & Eve Blais were checking us out, as were Dorinda Lyons and her daughter, Cheyenne, who had great fun playing with the Zoetemelk's granddaughter. Both have ponds, but Dorinda's is the newest and she was in need of koi; she probably didn't expect to get them here! Mac's neighbor Bob also showed up; he's *digging*. . . . Our newest members, William & Donice Lei, were here, as were some of our long-time favorites we don't see so often: Warren & Cynthia Fowler, Morris & Marie Nyquist, and Bryan Nobles, who had just turned 21 on the 17th! Mac led the birthday song (*good voice, too!*) for Bryan, as well as for Bonnie Henry (4th), Jack Marrin (16th), Joy Quirong, and any other March revelers.

great koi—seven of them—from our Rescue quarantine tank were auctioned off by Jack Marrin, with a \$20 minimum bid. They were all 15- to 20⁺-inch koi, all good looking, though not show fish. That's peanuts for size alone anywhere, so they were a steal to the three who bought them. One started a little four-way bidding war and went for \$75; Francine Hoffman got one, Armand Blais got one, and Dorinda stocked her pond with five! By the way, Mac took three calls just the week before from people who want to sell their koi—all up to 26-30 inches, so they claim. If anyone wants to buy, Mac has the contact information. Call him!

Answers are a given when we offer a panel of our club experts, but there's never only one answer to pond issues. On the panel this time were Tom Wright, Jack Marrin, Larry Leverett and Mark Krakower. Each knows what all the books say, and each knows what has worked for them and others. In between can be many answers; let's look at a few. . . .

from a preventative standpoint, should we maintain a percentage of **salt in the pond, and to what percent?** Tom suggested keeping a 0.3% salinity (3 pounds per 100 gallons water), maybe through March, but Jack said he quit salting because the koi tended to get used to it. He only salts now when required, prophylactically, to protect from or prevent disease; to kill a problem, he goes to 0.6% with 6 pounds salt per 100 gallons water.

the experts agree on **water change frequency and amounts:** We preach "*at least 10% weekly.*" In a straight-side pond, eye-ball the 10%: if 5' deep, 6" is 10%. A simple answer led to talk of ammonia (it's bad; ideal/normal is zero) and chlorine (do add dechlor at water changes; Jack makes his own). Ammonia 1.5ppm is a death hazard; controlled by nitrifying bacteria in filters and on pond walls, a spike (from a higher fish load or water temp, or overfeeding) must be stopped. Cut back on food and increase aeration until controlled; if constantly a problem, check the filter system.

Experts aside, Mac impressed all with his two go-to chemicals. He uses *OneFix* (2 Tbsp. every two weeks) to clear water cloudiness (Joe at Inland Koi tried it and it

cleared his tanks within two hours!) and *Vanish* (1 tsp/1000 gallons) in his water changes. Theo reminded all not to put a hose into the pond for filling: let it spray into it to de-chlorinate in the air. . . and so you can see it! Mac uses a timer on his hose, ever since he lost 13 fish one time. Ace Hardware's *nozzle timer* measures gallons or hours; Home Depot's version attaches at the faucet.

but moving on. . . . What to use for **weed control around the pond** besides my hands? Short answer, nothing: overspray kills koi. One guest has cobblestones around the pond and uses table or rock salt for weed control; the negatives: it kills the soil, and table salt is usually iodized and not for the pond. **Can you change bead filter media to another media**, and how tight can it be packed? Mark changed to a larger bead to reduce back-flushing frequency; it worked better. Larry said there's no reason not to exchange it; pack about 1/2 full. Orville reminded it depends on the filter design: some suck from the top (use floating media, and smaller is better), others drain from the bottom (use sinking media); the wrong media won't work well.

One related to **KHV: what's the incubation period?** It's a matter of temperature: at 72°F the *koi herpes virus* goes active; you can raise it to 85°F and overcome the virus, but surviving koi will be carriers for the rest of their lives. Years ago, Kodama Koi Farm in Sun City had it: they sold two fish, one to Chicago, one locally, and both ponds were heated. Both had a major kill; to stop it, Kodama *killed all his stock!* Drastic measures. Israel is leading research for a vaccine for the virus.

does anyone want/need some 5-gal buckets? Miguel Sierra, a painter, lets his young son earn money by cleaning the buckets; he's offering them for \$1 a bucket, 25¢ for lids, and the money goes to Ricky (951-970-8351).

not up for those? Club T-shirts from past pond tours are on clearance for \$10, smalls (kid-size) for \$5; the Leveretts (951-781-3887) have them. Scott & Liane Thomas have baby koi, 4-6", free for the taking on weekends; call (951-454-3827), catch and keep! (and get a sneak peek at one of this year's tour ponds!)

fit the day into your schedule and volunteer to work the June 1 Pond Tour in greater Riverside. You'll get a free breakfast, lunch and dinner and a new T-shirt just for spending the day with us. Mark Krakower (951-371-2223) is in charge of volunteers, and we'll have a sign-up list again at the April meeting.

all that and a raffle, too! With 65 at this meeting, the Fales put over 20 items on the raffle table. Even a big patio umbrella! That's always the fun way to end a meeting, and if you donate something for it, we'll give you extra tickets. We thank the McClains for their gracious hospitality and look forward to a never-seen-before pond for the next meeting. See you all there!

Pond Water Changes



- ◆ Water changes are simply the removal of some old pond water, and the replacement of that old pond water with new water.
 - ◆ Water can be chlorinated and ammoniated.
 - ◆ Failure to do water changes allows the accumulation of background pollution such as phosphates and proteins which inhibit fish health and growth.
 - ◆ "Topping Off" your pond is not a water change. You should know this about water: The solids in pond water do NOT evaporate, nor do many of the chemicals in the water.
 - ◆ Water changes are needed to replenish trace elements and minerals in your pond water which your fish need.
 - ◆ Chlorinated and chloraminated water is usually supplied to hobbyists "at the tap" from municipal water supplies. The water company adds these two chemicals to disinfect water.
 - ◆ Each day, municipal source-water is tested for eggs, spores, ova and cysts of various pathogens. If any are found, the municipal water authority may double or triple the chlorine or chloramine concentration.
- ◆ Spritzing the water into the pond slowly WILL dissipate a lot of chlorine, but not all of it. Dechlorinate to be sure the chlorine is gone and will not harm your fish.
 - ◆ When your municipal water supply uses Chloramine, you will be relieved to know that dechlorinator can still bind the harmful Chlorine. The remaining Ammonia should be no match for a cycled (properly functioning, well colonized) filtration system.
 - ◆ A koi in good pond water with plenty of water changes should grow at least 3-4 inches per year. Pond Keepers should be encouraged to follow a water change regimen as outlined here.

The table in the next column shows the residual concentrations as a function of water changes. To use the table look down to the number of water changes, and then across to the % change made each time.

For instance, if you have made 5 water changes of 15% each, you have reduced the original concentrations to a residual of 44.4%.

NO EXCUSE NOT TO QUARANTINE YOUR NEW KOI

Spike Cover did an extensive article on building a DIY quarantine system in the May/June 2003 issue of Koi USA. We who belong to the Inland Koi Society have been lucky enough to see and hear Spike demonstrate his "trash can" quarantine tanks at our meetings. He described three levels of quarantine systems for mini koi all the way through larger koi. Spike called it his minimum system (32 gallon trash can), intermediate system (75-125 gallon) and advanced (500 gallon show tank). Using his very explicit instructions, I built the intermediate sized Q system using a Rubbermaid 120 gallon horse trough and with his upgrade idea, I successfully quarantined two new koi with one of my expendable baby koi. I'm happy to say all survived and have moved into their larger, permanent home.



Key items to pay attention to are:

- Be sure to aerate the Q-tank very well
- Use established bio material from your existing filter
- Have some mechanical filtration in the system
- Feed only minimum amounts of food
- Heat the water to 74 degrees
- Salt the water, raising it from .10 to .30 % over 3 days


