POND AND HOST PROFILE Orville & Sandy Hanson - Riverside

Trville and Sandy Hanson have many intellectual achievements in their lives, but you may not know this because they are such a quiet couple. When you get to know them, you'll learn of their delightful wit, beautiful creativeness, loving and unselfish ways with their deeds and big hearts.

Four years ago, Orville retired after 38 years of Civil Service with the Dept. of Navy as an Electronic Engineer at the Naval Weapons Center in Norco, which influenced the elaborate detailing of their pond filtration, because he traveled to many Field Stations all over the world, including Japan, and accomplished building this pond once retired. A couple of years prior to Orville retiring, Sandy had retired after 15 years as Administrative Assistant from DynCorp.

The Hanson's have two children who were in Jr. High School when the family bought this house 35 years ago. Their beautiful home sits on a hill overlooking a canyon at the back of their 400ft long by 90ft wide property. When they bought the brand new house, the back yard was sloped, so the family terraced the back and Orville continues to work on it gather ing farming knowledge from past experiences. On one of the back thirds of their land, they've planted a citrus orchard (see if you can find the model-copy of one of the Chinese Terracotta Warriors), roses and a large raised garden bed of about twenty different vegetables. You just have to see what Orville has accomplished on their back two-thirds of massive hill! He has moved thousands of rocks or boulders and terraced the hill with trails, planters, trees, compost and water. Last time he counted, he had 31 fruit trees, but has added a few more since. There is an area which has no water, so Orville and Sandy created a botanical garden along with a California native area with wildflowers including California Poppies. Following the trail down the hill, you'll see a large Rainbow Eucalyptus tree, lavender plants, flowering Mantalai plant, blueberries, raspberries, grapes, and so much more, I can't list them all. It is so amazing!

Sandy categorizes areas in the back yard. You will see "the forest" with seven Coast Redwood Trees and a covered yard swing. In this forest is a working deer scare which the birds love to drink out of, several ceramic rabbits (Sandy like's rabbits), a copper bird bath which hummingbirds love to bath in and stepping stones. Another area is her "rock garden" which is bordered by sago trees, a trimmed juniper with 7 bird houses and ceramic figures. She showed us her 25 year old cannas and dahlias, and a newly planted azalea row. Sandy has created three bonsai trees and has a future one planned. She said these are all "little experiments".

When you arrive at the Hanson house, walk along the right side of the house to the back yard. There is a big swimming pool to the left side of the yard and after that is their Japanese inspired koi pond. In front of the pool on the left, you'll see a turtle and goldfish pond. Little Tuffy, the Red Eared Slider Turtle, lives peacefully with gold fish and when the fish come up to eat, so does he. Sandy has really enjoyed the turtle since she acquired if from club members, Bob and Bonnie Henry. This was the first pond Orville built twenty-five years ago and then the koi pond was built four years ago, after Orville retired. There is a blue authentic Japa-


nese tiled roof that borders the pond. This pond has an EPDM rubber liner covered with 1½ inches of mortar on top to make it look like a concrete pond. It also has lots of rock for edging and a beautiful waterfall. It seems the Hanson's have an endless supply of rocks. Two 4 inch bottom drains supply water from the pond to a variety of filters. Orville has been experimenting with different setups and has achieved some very clear water. The system consists of a vortex that feeds two Japanese filter chambers, and then goes through a total of 200 watts of U.V. He has a Foam Fractionator that takes out the organics. The Sequence Pump is variable rated and now is pumping 4000 gallons an hour, which is what Orville wants. He also has a filter system that is separate and ready to start up with a pre-filter sieve that is worth taking a look at.

Currently there are 19 koi in their pond. Sandy has a list of names so she can keep track of all and history of what is happening to them. Their favorite koi is named Mystic, but you'll have to question them to find out why. They've never lost a fish to illness or predator. They did have a suicide Sanke however. A heron stabbed it and the koi was quite listless, so Orville medicated it and put it in the quarantine tank. About three weeks later it was back like its original self so Orville put it back into the original pond and it was just fine. But then two months later, it jumped out of the pond and didn't survive.

You will notice the time change! We will meet at 3:00 PM this month, hoping to escape the heat. The day go light is longer and as the day gets later, the temperature cools considerably. Be sure to bring whatever you can for the shared potluck and don't forget your chairs. It will be a great meeting with Tom Ross as our quest speaker.

HARRISON'S KOI FARM Water Hardness in Koi Ponds

Water Hardness in Koi Ponds

Hardness is one of the most misunderstood characteristics of water, because it involves some rather complicated chemistry. In a nutshell, hardness describes the levels of minerals in water, primarily minerals containing calcium (Ca) and to a lesser extent, magnesium (Mg).

Water with lots of these minerals is called 'hard,' whereas mineral-poor water is called 'soft.' Water hardness is important for two main reasons. First (and most importantly), it keeps pH levels stable and relatively high. In any pond, pH tends to get more acid over time – even over 24 hours, natural processes can cause pH levels to change.

By absorbing or releasing acid, depending on whether it's plentiful or scarce, hardness minerals effectively keep pH constant, which is very important to the well-being of the fish. Because they prevent extreme shocks in pH, the hardness minerals are described as 'buffers,' and the level of buffers in the water is called its 'buffering capacity.' As the minerals are used up in the pond, the buffering capacity will decrease over time.

The second reason is that fish use minerals to make their structures, like scales and bone. Koi kept in water with high hardness levels will have brighter skin, scales and colors.

It's easy to see why high levels of water hardness are so desirable, and this is easily achieved in 'soft' areas by adding limestone chips or shells (such as mussel or oyster shells), commonly in the filter compartment.

Hardness may be described in terms of degrees (°dH) of 'general' or 'carbonate' hardness – abbreviated as GH or KH – and these two types of hardness are simply a measure of different parts of the hardness minerals. Both are very easily measured with test kits. Anything over 8°dH for GH and 4°dH for KH is fine. High or low levels will probably not directly impact a koi's health, but the appearance of the fish might be affected and the repercussions on other aspects of water quality should not be underestimated.

Hidden among the crowds at this year's Pond Tour was an IKS member on a covert mission with a single objective: Find out what the public was saying about the tour among themselves. The task proved to be an easy one. After reviewing the comments, many unsolicited, made by over 40 participants it was clear that the people who attended the tour really enjoyed and valued the time they spend with the IKS. Some of their comments are written below:

"Everyone working at this tour is so friendly, what a great club." "Spectacular staff." "These people are really excited about their hobby." Several people commented on how outgoing and positive the IKS homeowners and volunteers "all were."

Several of the participants said they had been on past pond tours and many verbalized strong positive memories of those tours. Many of these people said that this year's pond tour was: "the best ever."

About 20% of the participants had existing ponds and many of them want to rebuild or improve their pond; 60% did not want a pond, but enjoyed looking at the fish and yards; and the remaining 20% wanted to build a pond. Most people who wanted to improve or build a pond were open to joining the club. Furthermore, at least two of the participants spoke as if "finding the club" was like finding people from their native land, who spoke their native language, KOI. Topics of concern were ones we have heard regularly on past pond tours: sick fish, algae, leaks, filtration questions and problems, herons, raccoons, pond builders who did poor work, costs, plants, fears about having a pond and fish. These concerns were mixed with more positive statements, such as: "I came to see the beautiful Koi." "Oh, look at the plants, plants, plants, how do they do that?" "What a vision." "What a yard." The spawning going on at Pond #1, the Lewis Pond, was a great source of education, entertainment, innuendo, and humor.

Another interesting topic is how people ended up at our pond tour who did not intend to: "Found the pond tour by accident, it's my first encounter with Koi." "I was on my way to the Koi store and saw your sign" (darn, he saw the sign at about 3pm and barely squeezed in two ponds). The most frequent comment made by people who were referred to the tour by someone else was: "friends called me and told me about the tour because I already have a pond."

My two favorite comments came from a man who expressed frustration about his first attempt at pond building, who stated, "I'm taking the best ideas from each pond and I have an application to join the club" (smart man). And, according to Director Bob Henry, a couple who stated: "Our 10-year old brought us here and wants to build a pond." No doubt, the future of our hobby is in good hands.


